Dear Senator XXXX or Representative XXXXXX,

I am writing to you today in an effort to find out why no action has been taken on H.R. 190, The Social Security for Americans Only Act.

H.R. 190 was introduced in the House on January 7, 2007 and referred to the House Subcommittee on Social Security on January 18, 2007.

Since January 18<sup>th</sup> no progress has been made to move H.R. 190 onto the House floor for a vote.

On behalf of the 209,281 members and supporters of the Council of Seniors, I request your help in pushing for action on this important legislation.

I am also requesting that you encourage the creation of a companion bill in the Senate to help put a stop to this threat to Social Security.

The Council of Seniors and our members are opposed to the proposed Totalization agreement with Mexico.

We have been in contact with nearly four million citizens from across the country regarding the future of Social Security and the effects that entering into a Totalization agreement with Mexico will have on Social Security.

The results of a poll we conducted reveals that 93% of respondents are opposed to the United States entering into a Totalization agreement with Mexico.

The Council of Seniors is a national non-partisan, non-profit organization that works to educate, inform and advocate on behalf of our members regarding issues concerning the uncertain future of Social Security.


